Exciting Upgrades and Family-Friendly Enhancements at Willow Park!

To help promote more community engagement and support, while attracting people to come together and enjoy Village camaraderie, the administration is planning a number of new amenities for Willow Park. First and foremost, a new Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Accessible playground will be installed that will feature swings, slides, climbable structures and other fun obstacles to bring young children and their families together. Next, a concert stage venue and shade structure will be constructed at Willow Park so that local bands can entertain concert goers, fans and other residents who wish to enjoy some summer-fun while listening to local acts and bands. A shade structure will be incorporated to the footprint of the concert area, to provide needed relief in the sweltering summer heat, once again promoting outdoor activity and togetherness. Funding for the Willow Park amenities is coming from the deliberate effort of Village administrators to identify external agencies who align with the exciting vision we have for our Community, including from the Ohio Department of Natural Resources NatureWorks grant. New Equipment for Village Police and Fire Will Make Residents More Safe

The recent purchase of various important resources for the Village Police and Fire Department are certain to help enhance the service both entities are able to provide, and will help keep residents more safe and **secure**. In the Police Department, two new police cruisers were purchased to create even more street visibility and presence. These all-wheel-drive vehicles, will also be equipped with the latest technology for police officer convenience and will replace two vehicles that will be recycled out of the fleet. Funding for these police cruisers came from a variety of sources, as part of the Village's continual review of identifying external funding. In addition, the Village Fire Department also recently provided its team with 14 sets of new turnout gear, to better protect the lives of our Village's finest. The new turnout gear is lighter in weight and more comfortable for users. The Village of Grafton Fireman's Association graciously provided 50% of the funding for the total cost. In addition, Chief Thompson also recently stated the desire to have a Phase II turnout gear purchase next year, as a backup set. The turnout gear is comprised of flame retardant material to protect hands, legs, arms and feet.



The recent purchase of two new police cruisers and turnout gear will go a long way to keep the community safe and secure. Thank you to everyone for their continued support of our Village's public safety forces.



Becker Court Sidewalks Make Community More Walkable! TLCI Implementation Underway!

Residents, patrons and business owners in downtown Grafton and beyond are currently benefitting from the recent installation of 5-foot wide sidewalks on Becker Court. A majority of these new sidewalks are "extra-wide" and pedestrian-friendly, and essentially connect Center Street to Main Street creating one walkable loop for the first time in Village history. Enthusiasts can essentially "walk around the block." The funding for these new sidewalks comes from the Village leadership's effort to identify funding sources with the help of the Ohio Public Works Council since the T.L.C.I. initiative will help to improve walkability, connectivity and the overall spirit and wellbeing of the community.



The new sidewalks on Becker Court implement the recommendations made in the TLCI Report, and connect Center Street with Main Street for the first time in the community's history!

Solar Infrastructure Project Nearing Completion...Generating Natural Energy...and Lots of Excitement!



The Village of Grafton will be home to a future solar operation that will produce benefits for generations to come!

The much-anticipated Grafton solar development (Project Beacon) is nearing the final phase of construction. The 35-acre site hosting 4MW of solar electric generation experienced additional requirements and revised electrical-grid compliance standards added to engineered design.

As solar projects are being built in Ohio and many more being proposed, the electric grid has mounting concerns regarding system overload. The new compliance standards have evolved to include infrastructure that curtails power generation and added switching that disconnects the generation facility completely from Grafton's grid to prevent Grafton's generation from being reversed metered back into the PJM grid Grafton is normally supplied by.

Structurally the solar field is complete, panels are being installed and if all goes as planned, construction is complete, and all systems test and are approved t=for daily operations, Grafton electrical customers can expect to begin receiving solar

generated renewable energy delivered to their homes and businesses by November 2019.

This exciting project is one all of Grafton can be proud of. We believe this will be the largest single site solar facility in a multi-county region, possibly the largest in Northeast Ohio... and we've only just begun.



Village of Grafton Infrastructure Project Update

In the last edition, the Village updated the community on a number of infrastructure projects underway. Please see below to learn about even more updates on these projects and some new ones as well!

- Oak and Chestnut Phase I should have the paving installed with a few minor items to be completed.
- The equipment for the Wastewater Treatment Plant Improvements has been ordered and should be installed by the end of the year.
- Chestnut Phase II- construction plans are in the process of being engineered with a bid date proposed for late fall.
- The North Water Tower Rehab project- construction plans are being finalized with a bid date in late summer or fall.
- Applied for NatureWorks funding for improvements to the North Park pavilion and restrooms, the construction of a new pavilion and new swings and other all-inclusive playground structures.
- Applied for CDBG funding for new parking lot on the corner of Main Street and Becker Court.
- Applied for CDBG funding for improvements to make ADA accessible restrooms at the Community Room in North Park.
- Working on plans for improvements to State Route 57 from Erie Street to Mechanic Street as part of the TLCI Shared Vision Plan

These projects will benefit future generations of Village of Grafton residents and businesses!
