VETERAN'S MEMORIAL PROJECT RECEIVES HUGE BOOST WITH \$150,000 GRANT FROM STATE OF OHIO, CELEBRATE GRAFTON DONATION

The Village of Grafton's efforts to honor and support veterans in our community received a tremendous boost from the State of Ohio with the recent Capital Grant award of a \$150,000 capital grant will help fund construction of the final product. This amazing award, combined with earlier generous donations from the Celebrate Grafton 5K race and 1 mile walk, now raise the total donations to \$161,000.00 that will go towards the \$225,000.00 goal to fund a finished Veterans Memorial that will include a solemn and significant monument, beautiful landscaping, refined lighting, irrigation to keep the areas beautified and adjoining sidewalks. The project is anticipated to start construction fall of 2023 and should be completed next year as well. Special thanks goes out to Linda Bales, who worked closely to statewide elected representatives Gayle and Nathan Manning, to secure this funding. More information will be forthcoming as you continue to read upcoming editions of the newsletter. Thank you for your interest and support of the project.

The Village of Grafton would like to formally welcome Mark Kalinowski as the new Waste Water Treatment Plant Superintendent. Mark takes over this new role effective June 13th and has already hit the ground running, using his many years of experience in the public service and sanitation work. Mark is a Lorain County resident, living in Columbia Station. He was most recently employed by the Erie County Sanitation plant, where he served in the capacity of supervisor at their waste water treatment facility. He is a certified Class 3 Operator. The Village of Grafton will look to utilize his experience and integrity at the facility. He will be including improvements to the SCATA systems for more reliable reporting. He oversees a staff of 3 departments workers, four including himself. Mark will report directly to the administrator and the Mayor, and looks forward to creating sustainability for the waste water treatment facility, along with meaningful working relationships. PARSONS ROAD PROJECT UPDATE

The Parsons Road resurfacing project was recently awarded, as yet another infrastructure project that will keep benefitting residents for many years to come. The major resurfacing project will focus on the area of the Black River Bridge, east to Main Street, and the Black River west to the Metro Parks Royal Oaks location. Road projects such as the Parsons Road resurfacing including a top coating of materials to enhance the drivability experience for motorists and will include restriping the street topping as well. This added project will be a continuation of the overall Envision Grafton MAIN St., Phase I. project. Please drive safely as you see construction areas throughout the Village. These projects are intended to improve the community connectivity, so let's please practice responsible driving practices.







The Envision Grafton Project is becoming reality, as residents and businesses are aware of the sidewalk construction underway. By the time of this publication, east side lighting foundations will have been installed, to make way for the forthcoming illumination that is anticipated for the corridor. In the near future, lighting foundations on the west side of the street will be scheduled to be installed by the end of August. Sidewalks and aprons are being constructed and replaced, to help ease the walkability of Main Street.

RESERVOIR PARK PATHWAY LEADS TO ENHANCED WALKABILITY AND WELLNESS


