The Village of Grafton believes in investing in projects for the future so that later generations of residents and businesses can reap the benefits of today's sound and thoughtful planning. Please read below to see many of the projects which are underway, and those that are forthcoming in the near future.

#### WASHINGTON DRIVE BID WILL OPEN SOON!

Residents in and around the Washington Drive area can take great pride and comfort knowing that that the formal bid will open soon, and construction will begin later this summer for significant water line and pavement replacement enhancements. The Village of Grafton leaders have worked with professionals to design an operation where we will loop the water line into the water line on Woodland Chase. This is very important for several reasons. First, looping the lines will greatly reduce hammering of the overall system. Doing so creates less stress on the lines when hydrants are deployed for emergency uses or other needs. In addition to the water line upgrades, two turnarounds are being added for emergency vehicles. All impacted pavement will then be replaced. The Village is happy to report that major work for this project will be completed for this year.

#### CHIP-AND-SEAL WORK AT RESERVOIR PARK

Those in the community who have spent time at

Reservoir Park know that the vast property and watering hole is a hidden paradise of peace and tranquility. Many pedestrians visit for an enjoyable walk on the new pathways, or to visit for a ball game during the summer months. However, the entry to park is in dire need of repair and consequently, the Village is aligning with Lorain County's Chip-and-Seal Roadway Program to enhance the drive leading from Main Street into the parking areas. For an amount of approximately \$6,000, patchwork and filling will take place to mitigate the holes in the current drive and smooth the overall surface.



#### DOWNTOWN GRAFTON HAS TRULY EXPERIENCED A MAKEOVER! PHASE I NEARLY COMPLETE AND PHASE II TO BEGIN!

Anyone who has passed through Downtown Grafton must experience the life and energy breathed into the corridor with all of the improvements coming to fruition. The rear-in parking is in full effect, sidewalks have been reconstructed. There is beautiful foliage blossoming from annual flowers and new plant material, thanks to the deliberately designed flower scheme. And, who hasn't noticed the Earth Planter self-watering pots will be placed on every new street light pole bursting with colors. These new flowers have been timed so that there is great pride and impact of the summertime improvement to make us standout in a significant way.

Phase II for Envision Grafton has been awarded to Buckeye Construction, who will begin work in earnest this summer. Coming on the heels of Columbia Gas Company, who as installed a new gas main and lateral connections as parts of Elm Street and Willow Street, the Village will be installing new sidewalks on both sides of Main Street, upgrading the width from 4 feet to 5 feet, and some pedestrian-friendly sidewalks will be placed where none currently exist. Phase II will also include the installation of the crosswalk with rapid flash beacons (RFB) that will connect Reservoir Park and Willow Park. Let's improve connectivity from one end of the corps limits to the opposite!

#### WARD LINES BEING REDRAWN THROUGHOUT THE COMMUNITY

Every 10 years, new Ward Lines are considered for being redrawn, and such is the case this year in our community, where new boundary lines will take effect later this year. While informative letters with the most up-to-date information will be forthcoming from the Lorain County Board of Elections, the Village has laid out some cursory information for you here. The last time that Ward lines were redrawn in the Village of Grafton was 2000, and our community has grown since then. Two Council seats will be impacted by the Ward 3 and Ward 4 reconfiguration, although lines are redrawn community-wide. We encourage you to see the map on the opposite Page 4 to see what the new lines will be, and that were adopted by Council on May 16th's regular meeting. The Village engaged longtime mapping and GIS professionals Triad Group, to assist with the proper geographic line and mapmaking. Please take note of these changes, see the map nearby, lookout for the Lorain County Board of Elections letter, and contact the Village with any questions.


#### CONGRATULATIONS AMY BARNHART... ALL THE BEST IN RETIREMENT!

## **Continued from Previous Pages... and Other Updates!**

Continued phases of the Mechanic Street and Crook Street enhancements are underway. Phase 2 follows the 2021 Phase 1 construction of the watermain and hydrant replacements. Phase 2 included complete replacement of the **SANITARY SEWER** infrastructure including full blown replacement of the sewer main, replacement of all sanitary manholes and property laterals within the public right-of-way. Additional laterals were installed to serve township properties within the Grafton Sewer FPA. Significant **STORMWATER** improvements include a new 24" storm drainage infrastructure installed on both Mechanic Street and Crook Street serving all Village properties with each property receiving a storm lateral to be utilized by homeowners to manage their stormwater discharge. Parts of Chamberlin Road within the township were also connected within Grafton's stormwater system. All Village parcels received new driveway aprons and the project included community connectivity with the installation of new **SIDEWALKS** on both side of Mechanic Street and Crook Street, connecting Grafton's southeast residential neighborhood to Grafton's Downtown and Main Street. Completing the project will involve full **ROADWAY RESURFACING** of Mechanic Street and Crook Street and restoration and reseeding of front yards disturbed by the project

#### VILLAGE OF GRAFTON BOARD MEMBERS PUBLIC SERVICE OPPORTUNITY:

The Mayor has the authority to appoint individuals to boards and commissions with the approval of Council. Village of Grafton Mayor DiVencenzo seeks to fill vacancies on both the Village's Planning Commission and Board of Zoning Appeals. The meetings are generally scheduled the third Tuesday of the month when needed. Duties for each board can be found in Article VII of the Village of Grafton charter under the American Legal link on the Village's website, www.villageofgrafton.org. By Ordinance this is a COMPENSATED VOLUNTEER position where each board member is paid a set amount for each PC or BZA meeting attended.
