MEMORY LANE INITIATIVE AT WILLOW PARK TO COMMEMORATE LOVED ONES WITH TREE PLANTINGS

The Village of Grafton is happy to announce the continuation of a widely celebrated initiative that has helped to commemorate the love and life of a special someone for the residents of our community. Citizens are encouraged to celebrate the life of a loved one by planting a tree in Grafton Memory Lane at Willow Park. Throughout the fall, commemorative trees will be planted as a tribute to a loved one along the Willow Park driveway, so that all can be seen by those who pass through this restful area. Red maples, specifically, will feature the colors of vibrant red and deep purples and will be planted with a memorial plaque placed at the base of the tree. GRAFTON RESIDENTS ENCOURAGED TO SIGN UP FOR LORAIN COUNTY WENS ALERTS

Citizens in Grafton are encouraged to sign up for WENS Emergency Alerts from Lorain County, as an easy method by which you can obtain notifications about weather-related changes, traffic re-routing messages, updates, and more urgent information. In addition, by signing up at the nearby link, residents will receive Lorain County emergency alerts and public service announcements. In the event of an emergency, an alert may be sent to the phone number(s) you provide and/or your email address. Alerts sent from Lorain County will originate from 69310 for text messages and (440) 328-2117 for voice notifications. Please be sure to save these in your phone book, once you sign-up, so that you are aware.


PLEASE BE SURE TO UPDATE YOUR UTILITY BILLING NOTIFICATIONS





Village of Grafton Infrastructure Projects and Progress Being Made All Around Town

ENVISION GRAFTON PHASE II UNDERWAY AND PROGRESSING FORWARD

Residents in our community are certainly aware of the Envision Grafton initiative, which has helped to stimulate a major transformation among our downtown area over the last several years. With Main Street Phase I behind us, the community can expect Phase II to be conducted with similar candor, speed, and improvement for Grafton. This project includes increasing storm water capacity and adding yard drains on residential parcels for lower-lying areas. Curbs and gutters are being installed throughout the project as well. The parameters of the project are Main Street and Mechanic Street South to Willow Park. Another major aspect of this project is the re-alignment of Elm Street to Main Street in a complete 90 degree turn, along with the relocation of Willow Street and Main Street, making Willow Street a 90 degree turn as well. Essentially, this project eliminates the former 5-points crossing in Grafton, so that pedestrians and motorists can have appropriate periphery and visual sightlines. As has been reported in the past, funding from the project has come from the T.L.C.I. grant of N.O.A.C.A., Ohio Department of Transportation safety funds, monies from Ohio Public Works Commission and Village Funds. Finally, we will connect Willow Park with Reservoir Park to create the safest intersection possible, with sidewalk access, crosswalks, and rapid flash beacons. Thank you for your continued support of this project!

WASHINGTON DRIVE AND WOODLAND CHASE AREA UPGRADES WILL IMPROVE STREETS AND SAFETY

Continued infrastructure improvements are being made throughout the community in the neighborhoods as well, such as in the area of Washington Drive and Woodland Chase. With bid approval taking place at the July 18th meeting of Village Council, the community can expect the project to begin this fall. The need for such upgrades in this area are prompted by the need for a complete Water Line replacement as the driving force. In order to help accommodate such water line work, residents will see pavement improvements underway as well. Specifically, the Village will loop the line with Woodland Chase to reduce water system line hammering, and partial sidewalk replacements will take place as well. To accommodate safety vehicles, at the very end of Washington Drive and Woodland Chase, a large "T" will be integrated in order to permit emergency safety vehicles to turn around. Keep on the lookout for more updates of this important neighborhood project.

MECHANIC STREET AND CROOK STREET PROJECTS NOW COMPLETE!

The community can obtain a sense of civic pride in knowing that the Mechanic Street and Crook Street project is now successfully complete. All new sewers have been installed on Mechanic Street, just south of Railroad Street. In addition, Crook Street west of Mechanic Street has received new storm water and sanitary lateral lines. Every Village property has received benefits. In fact, the Village has done 7 Township parcels that were in our Federal Planning Authority, and will soon become part of our system.

EASTERLY SEWER PROJECT A FUTURE FOCUS AND PROACTIVE STEP FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

The Easterly Sewer Project Interceptor is emerging as a priority for the Village on the far east side of our community, as a way for the first time to grant public sanitary sewer access for those on the east side of town. The project is being pursued in order to enhance economic development opportunities in and around the adjacent areas, since the Village owns approximately 800 acres of land designated for future commercial and industrial development. With an eye out for the future, the Village is hoping that making priority of these infrastructure projects will make this undeveloped location more attractive in the future. In fact, the Village has an application out for funding for this area. Specifically, officials are looking for \$1.9 million from the Economic Development Agency at the federal level and we are also looking for funding from other agencies. Grafton has also asked for approximately \$750,000 from the federal capital budget. Finally, with the combined funding attempts from the various federal economic development and budgeting outlets, Grafton is anticipating a partnership with the Lorain County Commissioners low or no-interest loan, potentially with forgiveness from the Lorain County Commissioners. We wish to thank the great attention from Team NEO and Jobs Ohio for helping to promote this project. Please stay tuned in the near future.

MILLING AND RE-PAVING OF ERIE, HURON, AND ONTARIO STREET TO BEGIN IN 2024!

As a way to continue enhancing neighborhood infrastructure to the best of our funding abilities, the Village of Grafton intends to go to bid in early 2024 for the purpose of repaving Erie, Huron, and Ontario Street. Doing such construction will be cost-beneficial, and will help restore traffic flow and improve overall roadway access.

NOVAK ROAD ENHANCEMENT

The Novak Road Corridor will be subject to a 3-Phase project, including sanitary sewer size improvement, from Novak to Elm Street. Over time, the curbs and gutters will be replaced on both sides of the road, along with the addition of sidewalks on both sides of the road. Utilities have already been completed. The total project cost will be \$4.2 million, and currently, Village officials have funding in place for the first phase, from approximately Main Street east to Wellfleet. Keep on the lookout for more updates on this project!
